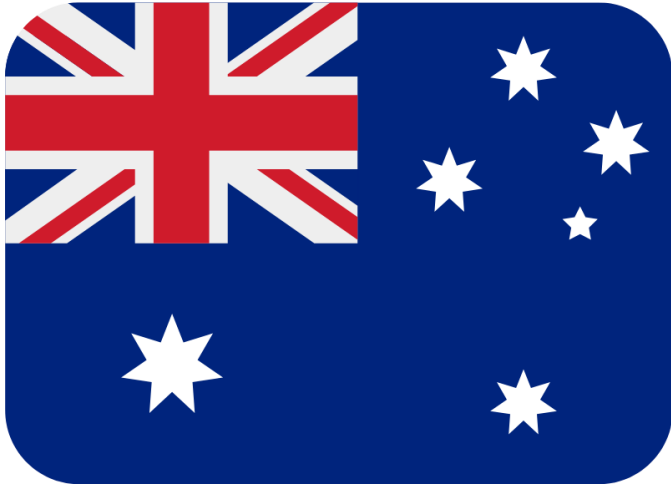




Study in AUSTRALIA with





Overview

Australia is a country of 24.5 million people that offers much more than natural beauty, bush tucker, kangaroos, and koalas. As counted among the best countries to study abroad for international students, Australia had about 690,468 students in 2018. There was an 11% increase in students from 2017 to 2018.

A study conducted by the University Colleges of London's Centre for Global Higher Education suggests that Australia will take the number two spot after the United States for study abroad destinations. Australian education, boasting 1,100 institutions and 22,000 courses, ranks highly in the world's top universities and impacts society by producing high-level global achievers. International students can easily find a school and field that suits their needs in Australia, as universities are home to various courses and degrees. International students have a choice of universities, vocational schools, or English study. Still, if you are confused about your course, you can get help from the overseas consultants of Soukveda.

Seven Australian cities are among the top 100 cities according to QS Best Student Cities 2019, whose ranking is based on several different aspects, including feedback from students, university rankings, student diversity, employer relationships, and cost of living. Australians enjoy one of the world's highest standards of living. In Australia, living and tuition costs are considerably lower than in the United States and the United Kingdom. Students from abroad can work part-time while they study, reducing their living expenses. Scholarships are available to help international students lower their costs of study. Australia also has a large number of immigrants who speak English as a first language.

Australia's education system is divided into three distinct categories: primary, secondary, and tertiary. School education in Australia comprises primary, secondary, and senior secondary education for 13 years, which is equivalent to finishing the 12th grade in India. Higher education in Australia is equivalent to the university programs of India, and vocational studies are comparable to the diploma courses in India that focus on skill development.

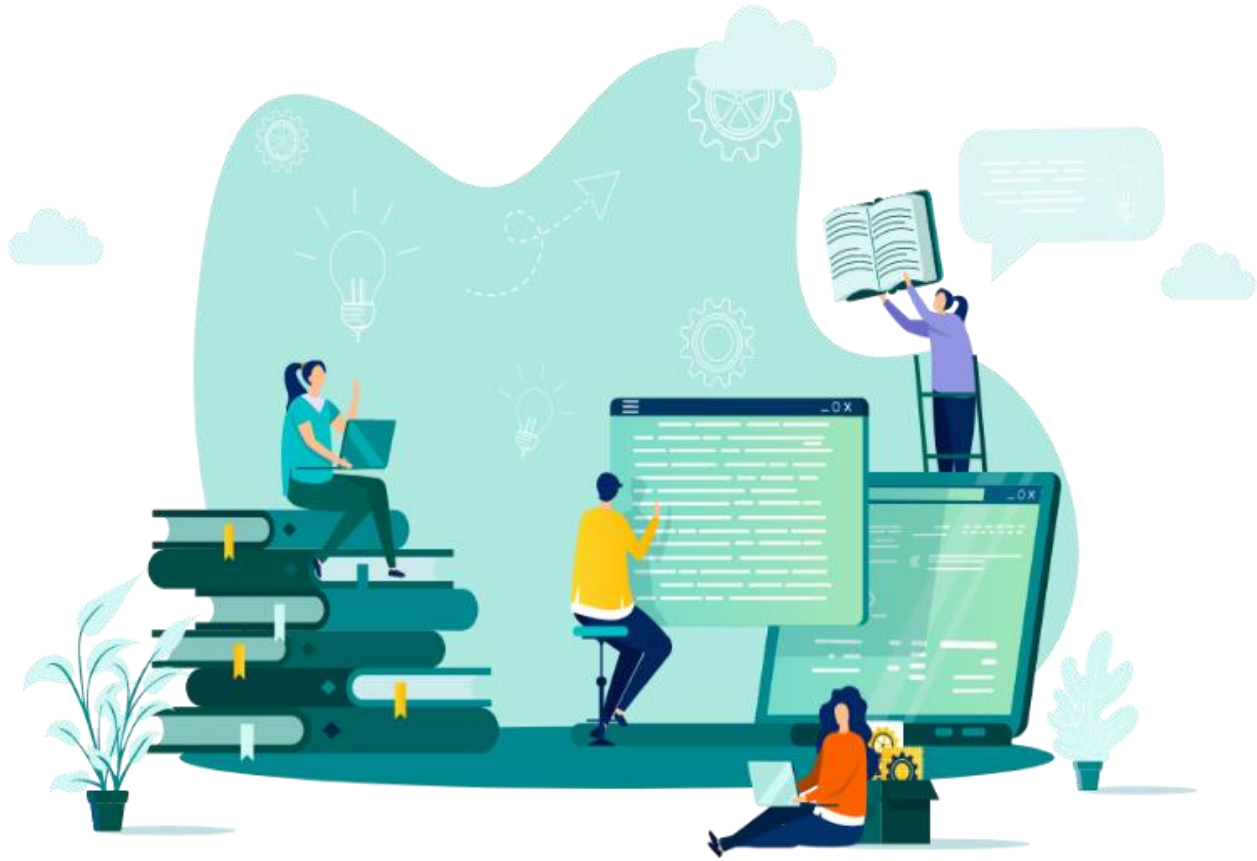

University majors tend to offer Doctorate, Master's, and Bachelor's degrees, but the following table outlines programs offered by VETs in Australia. The institution may require up to 12 classes equivalent to Australian education in order to obtain admission. Admission Process to Study In Australia

Depending on the program, Australian universities have varying requirements. The following table summarizes the higher education qualifications in Australia.

Level of Course	Admission Requirements	Duration
Associate degree	12th Pass or Certificate III or IV	2 Years
Bachelor degree	12th Pass or Certificate III or IV	3 Years
Bachelor degree (Honours)	It is possible that you can graduate with an Honours degree after earning your bachelor's degree and doing well in it.	4 Years

It is a common concern of international students while looking for the best courses to study abroad whether Australian institutions will acknowledge their country's degree. The National Office of Overseas Skills Recognition (NOOSR), an Australian Government organization, works closely with educational bodies to recognize overseas qualifications.

Requirements

For those who are coming from countries where English is not their first language, you will need to take either IELTS, TOEFL, PTE, or CAE. The most popular ones are IELTS and TOEFL. This is important not only for student admission but also for visa requirements for study abroad programs.

The following is a rough look at the general score requirements, although they vary quite a bit. Still, if there is any doubt, you can get in touch with Soukvedas, to understand the requirement and procedures to go abroad for studies in India.

Tests	Required Score for Admission
IELTS	At least 7 is required for each of the 4 test categories
TOEFL	At least 24 is required for listening, 24 for reading, 27 for writing, and 23 for speaking
PTE Academic	At least 65 is required for each of the 4 test categories
CAE	At least 185 is required in each of the 4 test categories
OET	At least 185 is required in each of the 4 test categories

Cost of Attendance to Study in Australia

When selecting a country for studying abroad, it is vital to know the cost involved. Studying in Australia can be either very expensive or affordable depending upon a range of factors, including the level of study (graduate or postgraduate) and where the institution is located. Aside from tuition, living costs, and accommodation, there may be additional costs for course materials and access to resources at an institution. There is a slight difference between tuition fees in smaller Australian cities and suburban areas and city residents such as those in Sydney and Melbourne. VISA

The next step is to apply for your visa after the university has given you the green light. Student visas for Australia are easier to obtain than in other countries. Visas for Australian students are only granted if they meet certain requirements. As soon as you enroll full-time, you can apply for a subclass 500 student visa. Applicants for Australian student visas need to plan ahead and apply accordingly since processing takes four to six weeks. Before applying for the Visa for studying in Australian Universities, you need to have some prerequisites and then follow the steps, have a look:



Before applying for the Visa for studying in Australian Universities, you need to have some prerequisites and then follow the steps, have a look:

- Must have a valid passport.
- Find out which visa you should apply for.
- If you are studying full-time, a subclass 500 is most likely your choice.
- Register for an account.
- Add the documents to your account.
- You may also include passport information, email addresses, and your address.
- Submit your visa application fee.
- Appear at the Visa office for an interview.
- Provide biometric and character certificates at the Visa office
- Consult panel doctors for a health checkup and obtaining the health certificate.

Note: It is essential to translate documents in other languages into English. If you live in Australia, you must have a translator who is accredited by the National Accreditation Authority as accredited for Translator and Interpreters.

Top Scholarships in Australia

Many scholarships are available to international students studying in Australia every year from the Australian Government and Australian Universities. For international students who wish to obtain a degree in Australia, the Australian Government and Australian universities offer a number of Ph.D. Scholarships.

Australian Government Scholarships:

- **AUSTRALIA AWARDS SCHOLARSHIPS**

Previously known as Australian Development Scholarships (ADS), Australia Awards Scholarships are comparatively long-term awards managed by the Department of Foreign Affairs and Trade. Their purpose is to provide full-time undergraduate and postgraduate study abroad scholarships at participating Australian universities and Technical and Further Education (TAFE) institutions to people from developing countries, particularly those in the Indo-Pacific region.

- **DESTINATION AUSTRALIA SCHOLARSHIPS**

Under the Destination Australia scholarships program, the Australian Government assists international and Australian students. Over 1000 scholarships worth \$15,000 will be awarded each year in support of study and living expenses for students attending a regional campus of an eligible university in Australia to study a Certificate IV to Doctorate level qualification.

- **INTERNATIONAL POSTGRADUATE RESEARCH SCHOLARSHIPS**

Students enrolled in IPRS can gain real-world research experience with leading Australian researchers and study in Australia as part of their postgraduate research degree. Students can apply for a Master's Degree by research scholarship for two years or a Doctorate by research scholarship for three years. Studying abroad scholarships covers tuition and health benefits.

Australian University Scholarships

- **UNIVERSITY OF SYDNEY INTERNATIONAL RESEARCH SCHOLARSHIPS**

Students may extend the program by one semester if they are Ph.D. students. Tuition fees and a living allowance will be covered for up to three

- **MACQUARIE UNIVERSITY INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS**

Scholarships range in amount from AUD 2,000 to 10,000 or more.

- **GRIFFITH REMARKABLE SCHOLARSHIPS**

For the duration of the program, the scholarship covers 50% of tuition.

- **UNIVERSITY OF MELBOURNE GRADUATE RESEARCH SCHOLARSHIPS**

Students who receive scholarships will also receive a living allowance, relocation grant, and health insurance.

- **ADELAIDE GLOBAL EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIPS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS**

Scholarships covering 50% of the tuition fees can be obtained for international students who have shown exceptional academic performance in their prior studies.

- **FLINDERS INTERNATIONAL POSTGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS**

As part of the scholarship, students are covered for their tuition fees, living allowance, moving expenses, and travel expenses.

- **UNSW INTERNATIONAL SCHOLARSHIPS**

Work Opportunities in Australia

International students are permitted to work while undertaking full-time government-recognized courses in Australia and most other countries. As an international student, you shouldn't expect to live entirely on your income while you study, but the extra income you make will certainly help meet your financial obligations.

However, if you are studying abroad and working simultaneously, you need to follow some country rules and regulations. Here are the working criteria for international students in Australia:

- When accompanying family members or your spouse, they can work for up to 20 hours per week after you begin your course. A maximum of 20 hours is allowed at any one time.
- After you receive an official acceptance letter, you can apply for a student visa for Australia.
- A student must consistently fill out the requirements of the program in which they are enrolled.
- A student must maintain regular attendance according to the program requirements.
- It is mandatory for you to stay covered under your Overseas Student Health Coverage (OSHC).

Note: Students may also volunteer at charitable organizations and nonprofits, which is a great way to meet people, gain real-world experience, and contribute to the community.
